How do all members of our school community behave?

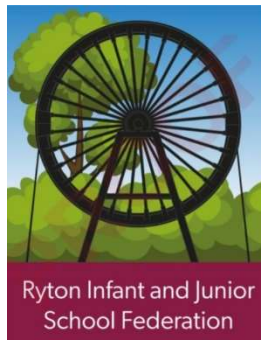
- We listen to one another and we appreciate being listened to
